With heat reaching elevated levels, now is the time to take steps to prevent heat-related illnesses. The basic concepts of water, rest, and shade are core elements of the OSHA Heat Illness Prevention Campaign. Note that OSHA currently has a National Emphasis Program on heat hazards. This program allows for inspections in targeted workplaces, including construction. On heat priority days, when the heat index is expected to be 80°F or higher, OSHA will assess the potential for heat-related illnesses, injuries, and deaths where heat-related hazards may exist.


