STUDENTS TOUR FERN HOLLOW BRIDGE SITE

On Friday, September 16, 12 students from the University of Pittsburgh, Carnegie Mellon University, and West Virginia University visited the Fern Hollow Bridge Project site.

Chad Basinger, Vice President of Project Management for Swank Construction Company, led the site tour. Basinger reviewed the project plans of the new structure replacing the Fern Hollow Bridge that collapsed on January 28, 2022, and answered questions regarding the project's design, material procurement process, and progress.

After reviewing the project plans, students were invited down to the construction site to view the project in person.

Matt Lambros from SAI Consulting Engineers, PennDOT's lead inspector on the project, also provided students with additional insight, fielded questions, and reviewed the current and next stages of the project.

James Clark, a senior civil engineering major at the University of Pittsburgh, and president of its AGC Student Chapter says, "We can learn a lot in classes, but it is a completely different experience to see it being built in the field. When you see the project, and the people building it, the struggles they go through, there is always something good to take into consideration when you are back at an office working the

engineering side of it."

CAWP's Constructors Leadership Council chair Nathan Miller from Northeast Paving also attended the tour to encourage students to become active in their AGC student chapters.
