## Anti-Harassment Training and Resources *Available Now!*

On March 23, 2023, CAWP unveiled a new type of antiharassment training, RESPECT. Instructor Fran Sepler of Sepler & Associates reviewed the program which is designed to educate company managers and supervisors on building a more respectful workplace through a series of educational content and videos.

This program is now accessible at <u>CAWPRESPECT.ORG</u> and is offered at no charge to CAWP members.

There, you will find several resources to help train your supervisors to create a respectful workplace by using the *Respect* video series, which includes:

- A 30-minute video designed to assist supervisors in responding effectively to employee concerns and reports of misconduct or disrespectful behavior
- Four short (10-15 minute) videos on a variety of related topics, to be used as reinforcement of the overall message of the program
- Handouts and other resources like toolbox talks for supervisors to reference and use
- The Respect Pledge



### Help AGC Improve Highway Work Zone Safety by Completing the 2023 Highway Work Zone Safety Survey by Friday, May 12


AGC and survey partner HCSS will use survey results to urge motorists to be careful during the summer travel season.
