Pitt's IRISE Hosts Annual Meeting to Showcase Infrastructure Research and Innovation

The University of Pittsburgh's Impactful Resilient Infrastructure Science and Engineering (IRISE) program held its annual meeting on Thursday, May 22, 2025, at Benedum Hall on the university's Oakland campus. The event highlighted both completed and ongoing research initiatives aimed at solving critical highway infrastructure challenges.

IRISE, housed within Pitt's Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering, fosters collaboration between public infrastructure agencies and private sector firms to develop innovative, research-based solutions for resilient and sustainable highway systems.

Since joining the IRISE consortium in 2019, the Constructors Association of Western Pennsylvania (CAWP) has contributed its expertise in highway construction safety. As a strategic partner, CAWP supports efforts to improve safety protocols through cutting-

edge technologies and practical applications.

At this year's meeting, CAWP Executive Director Rich Barcaskey led a panel discussion focused on the implementation of one of IRISE's safety initiatives: *A Novel Immersive Virtual Reality (VR) Platform for Highway Construction*. The project aims to revolutionize training for construction workers, consultants, and inspectors through immersive VR simulations that replicate real-world highway construction environments.

Panelists included Jason Zang, District Executive for PennDOT District 11; Ed Skorpinski of the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission; and Andy Hanchulak of Golden Triangle Construction. Together, they explored the potential of VR technology to enhance safety awareness and preparedness on job sites across the region.

IRISE's consortium includes key infrastructure stakeholders such as PennDOT, the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission, Allegheny County, Golden Triangle Construction, Michael Baker International, CDR Maguire, and CAWP, all working collaboratively to advance the future of transportation infrastructure.



CAWP CLC Assists in Urban Impact Foundation Renovation

On Thursday, May 29, 2025, the CAWP Constructors Leadership Council (CLC) contributed to the Pittsburgh North Shore community by assisting in the renovation of a residential home for the Urban Impact Foundation (UIF).
