Recent research suggests that our overall well-being, emotions, and moods can be influenced by the food we eat. By eating more vegetables and fruits, taking certain nutritional supplements, and minimizing the consumption of ultra-processed foods, evidence has been provided for positive outcomes in mental health, as well as improvements in depression symptoms, highlighting the role of nutrition in mental health.

In this article, the American Psychological Association outlines how foods known to support general health also promotes healthy brain function, and how organizations are using nutritional psychology interventions to boost behavioral health in workplaces, schools, and beyond.
